GOOD YARD WASTE DISPOSAL PRACTICES

Keep plastic from blowing into the creek. Place loose plastic items, like food wrappers and plant containers, in your garbage bin



Dog owner? Dog poop bags belong in your garbage bin, not in your yard waste pile (or your neighbor's)



Plastic bottles, soda cans, and cardboard boxes can go into your blue recycling bin
